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## Mercer County Commission Minutes May 1, 2024

Sheriff Terry Ternes requested approval of a letter of support for funding of two civil emergency sirens for Beulah Bay and Hazen Bay areas. This \$50,000 project will be cost shared 15% county, 75% federal and 10% state, through a state mitigation grant. Folk moved to accept the letter of support for sirens at Beulah and Hazen Bay. Taylor seconded. All voted aye. Motion carried. Jennifer Neumiller, Tax Director/Land Use Administrator, presented the following zoning/temporary use permit:

1. Temp Use #634 issued to Arlen Krutti. Renewal of a non-farm residence to be used as a rental house, located at part of parcel 1 within SE4NE4 of Section 10 T144N R87W. Conditions include renewal through County Commissioners each year. Permit expires December 31, 2024.

Frey moved to approve temporary use permit #634. Folk seconded. All voted aye. Motion carried.

Darren Hellman with Coteau Properties presented an amendment to the 2005 road closure resolution reroute agreement. Folk moved to approve the amendment as presented. Taylor seconded. All voted aye. Motion carried. Recessed at 9:49 a.m.

Reconvened at 9:57 a.m.

At 10:00 a.m., Frey moved to close the acceptance of bids for the Mercer County Highway department motor grader bid letting. Bauman seconded. All voted aye. Motion carried. Road Superintendent Ken Miller opened all bids and once all bids are verified, will bring recommendations to the commission for approval.

Interstate Engineer Charlie Hankins opened the bids for the 51<sup>ST</sup> Ave SW (Airport Road) project and once all bids are verified will bring recommendations to the commission for approval.

Miller requested permission to hire four parttime summer help positions at \$20/hour. Frey moved to approve hiring and advertising for four parttime summer help positions at \$20/hour. Bauman seconded. All voted aye. Motion carried. Hankins stated that he had resubmitted the \$3,000 bill from the John Schield's bridge change order BRO-00390-(056) to the state for approval.

Miller is requesting to pre-approve the purchase of a truck tractor for \$39,900 if it turns out to be a good deal for the county. It was decided that a special meeting would be called if this purchase became necessary.

Frey moved to approve the gaming site authorization for the Hazen Winter Sports Association, ONC. Bauman seconded. All voted aye. Motion carried. HR Director Alice Grinsteinner along with Sheriff Ternes informed the board about the 911 Coordinator position changes and requested approval to give Kent Roth a \$243/month raise for taking on the 911 Coordinator responsibilities and give Ashley Hill a \$1.18 per hour raise for taking on the GIS/Mapping responsibilities. Reconvened at 11:47 a.m.

HR Director Alice Grinsteinner gave an update on county wide open positions. Requested board approval to require all salary exempt employees turn in only their full days off of vacation and sick leave for payroll. Grinsteinner will provide the new documentation for these employees. Taylor moved to approve that all salary exempt employees turn in only their full days of vacation and sick leave used for the payroll period and paperwork will be provided by HR. Frey seconded. Folk recused herself. Taylor, Frey, Bauman, and Wolf voted aye. Motion carried. Grinsteinner reported an incident with an employee that had enough hours to only qualify for 50% of their health insurance and the other 50% that was taken out of her check. States Attorney Todd Schwarz recommended that the additional funds that were taken out need to be reimbursed to the employee. Folk made a motion to reimburse this employee the funds that were deducted from their paycheck, effective immediately. Taylor seconded. All voted aye. Motion carried.

Portfolio updates were given.
