

**Mercer County Commission Minutes
March 3, 2026**

Folk moved to approve Chapter 1, Section VIII-Definitions as presented. Wolf seconded. All voted aye. Motion carried. Voigt moved to close the Public Hearing and open the regular meeting. Wolf seconded. All voted aye. Motion carried.

The Public Hearing for the 3rd Reading to Amend Mercer County Zoning Ordinance: Chapter 1, Section VIII-Definitions: Definitions added for Data Center & Digital Asset Mining was set for the next regular meeting on March 18, 2026 at 9:45 a.m.

Michael Berg, Wes Klein and ND State Representative Bill Tveit were among the many Mercer County residents who conveyed their concerns regarding the Nextera Energy Resources (NEER) and Basin Electric Cooperative purposed data center project. NEER Project Director Stephanie Morales also spoke. The residents asked the Board to put a moratorium in place until zoning ordinances and public policy were better established to ensure that local control could be maintained. States Attorney Todd Schwarz was present and part of this discussion. Folk moved to put a 1-year moratorium on data centers being permitted. Guenther seconded. Folk, Guenther, and Voigt voted aye. Wolf and Bauman voted nay. Motion carried.

Reconvened at 11:24 a.m.

Building Maintenance Supervisor Jim Albers and Deputy Auditor Mark Erhardt presented an update on the status of the recently purchased Beulah Building (Roughrider RV Property) and asked for direction and budgetary restraints.

2025 Budget Amendments were presented by Auditor Reed. Wolf moved to approve the following 2025 Budget Amendments: General Fund Miscellaneous -\$201,718.55 over appropriations due to Commission approved expenditures. Commission Board Member Bauman -\$785.99 due to 2024 reimbursements paid in 2025, Clerk Of Court -\$7,430.81,

due to uncontrolled legal court fees, Recorder -\$7,132.67, due to approved wage bump up, Sheriff Temporary Deputy -\$37,640.64 due to temporary deputy work, and NDSU Extension Agent -\$15,122.21 due to NDSU's new budget year starts in July and agents got wage increases. Voigt seconded. All voted aye. Motion carried. Portfolio Updates were given.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 11:44 a.m. The next regular meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, March 3, 2026, at 9:00 a.m. in the boardroom of the Mercer County Government Center in Stanton, North Dakota.
